Awarded by the Selection Committee at the Opening Party.

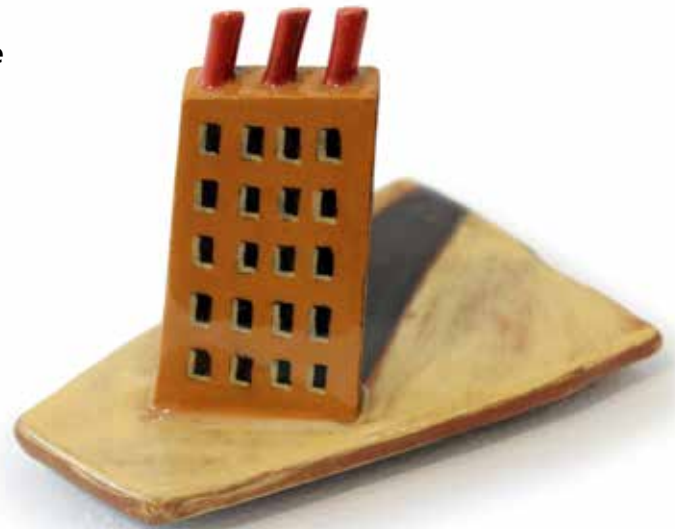


Image: Jenny Southam ceramics. Winner of the President's Prize in *The Summer Show* 2018

## The Summer Show continued...

### SUBMISSION DETAILS

#### Delivery of work: 8, 9 & 10 July

We cannot accept late submissions.

Submissions **MUST** be delivered with a completed stock sheet which also includes:

- Date the work was made
- "made by [elected maker]" or "in the workshop of [maker]" with assistants credited by name

*Please note, only furniture makers may deliver their work before 9am on the selection day by prior arrangement with Sharyn Baker.*

#### Selection day: 11 July

Those who have submitted will receive the results of the selection via email. **It is very important that you check your emails on 12 July!**

A member of the shop team will be in attendance on the selection day. If work is not selected, they will decide whether the piece is appropriate for the shop. The Member will be notified accordingly in the result email and must confirm with us on Friday 12 July whether they would be happy for it to go into the shop or would like to collect it.

#### Collection of unselected work: 12, 13 & 14 July

Please collect promptly.

#### Collection of work after exhibition: 9, 10 & 11 September

Please collect promptly.

We appreciate that distance can be an issue when considering submitting for *The Summer Show*, due to the possibility of two trips in one week if work is not selected. Some Members have found that car sharing with other Members in their area provides a good solution. Why not ask on the Members' Facebook Forum?

### SUBMISSION CRITERIA

Work created for *The Summer Show* must adhere to the following submission criteria:

- Entries should be of exhibition quality.
- Makers should concentrate on quality not quantity.
- Work must not have been exhibited or seen under the Guild banner before.
- Work must be **NO MORE** than 2 years old.
- Work must be entirely under the control of the maker.
- Work must be submitted with a completed stock sheet.
- Additional presentation materials (e.g. frames, mounts, stands, mechanisms etc.) must be of the same high standard as your actual work.

Members are welcome to submit in any craft media and/or collaborate with other Members, provided that all the above criteria are met.

### CHANGES FOR 2019

In 2018 we undertook the Selection Election Committee Review which included feedback from many of you. Following this review, the changes introduced to *The Summer Show* selection process which will commence this year are:

1. the submission criteria no longer states that work must be consciously different from that sold in the shop
2. no feedback will be given to Members whose work is not selected
3. up to 3 exhibition staff can join the selection and vote (retaining the majority of votes for Committee members)

## **EXHIBITOR STATEMENTS FOR EDUCATIONAL OUTPUT**

Outreach is a crucial part of every exhibition and we take every opportunity to inform and inspire our visitors about craft and about the people who make it. This information will be presented in exhibitor statements and images available in the exhibition. For this year's show we would like each exhibitor to focus on:

### **Tools of the Trade**

Every craftsperson has to use a tool in some part of their making progress and we would like to put these tools in the spotlight.

You may find them such a common everyday item, but some of our visitors may never even have heard of them before, and we thought it was about time they did.

So why not tell us about your tools of the trade?

Visitors will learn about your crafting instruments through statements, images and potentially having some tools available on display for visitors to see up close.

### **STATEMENT**

So if you are planning to submit work for *The Summer Show* then we'd be grateful if you would please write a paragraph or two about what your tools mean to you. You could consider the following questions, or head off in your own direction, but keep it to no more than 300 words.

1. What tools do you use the most?
2. Which of your tools is irreplaceable?
3. What is your favourite tool?
4. Why is it your favourite?
5. What was the first tool that you bought?

### **IMAGES AND SKETCHES**

Please also send up to 3 images relating to your statement, and if you're feeling really creative these could also include sketches of your chosen tools. (Images should be 300 dpi)
