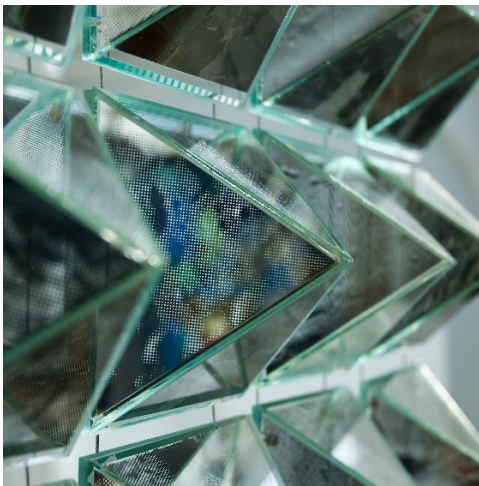

A 'maximalist' exhibition showing a wide range of pattern will be opening soon at Devon Guild of Craftsmen.

Found everywhere we look, at its simplest a pattern in art may be a geometric or other repeating shape, as in wallpaper. However a pattern need not necessarily repeat exactly, but can be subverted or changed according to the whims of the designer as long as it has some form of organizing "skeleton".

Devon Guild of Craftsmen challenged their many multi-disciplined Members to interpret the theme as tightly or loosely as they liked in order to extend their design and making skills. The result is an exhibition containing a riotous mix of pattern!



Creating a pattern can be more complicated than you might think, and a useful challenge for a maker's design skills. It may be something makers work with on a daily basis in their practice, or it may be out of their daily vocabulary if they usually only make one-offs.

This exhibition will show interpretations on the theme in a variety of media, from ceramics to paper, jewellery to glass. Many of the exhibiting makers have responded to the call in order to stretch their repertoire.
